Working to Protect Children

About The Lucy Faithfull Foundation

Our vision is of a society where children are free from sexual abuse and exploitation.

Our mission is to prevent abuse from happening by working in partnership with voluntary and statutory sector professionals as well as the general public.

The majority of children who suffer sexual abuse are abused by someone they know, someone in their family or social network. This makes it incredibly hard for them to tell anyone. This is why we, as adults, must do as much as we can to protect them.

Lucy Faithfull Foundation services, programmes and projects are designed to place a protective shield around children, to help prevent abuse from happening ever, or from happening again. Our specialist staff work with everyone involved in a child's life, tackling the problem from all angles so that children are as safe as they can be.

Where abuse has already taken place, we work with all those affected including adult male and female abusers; young people with harmful sexual behaviour; children with concerning sexual behaviours; victims of abuse and other family members. But we also work in families and with adults and young people where there has been no abuse, to help them keep themselves and others as safe as possible.

This comprehensive approach is the only way we can effectively tackle child sexual abuse.



What will your money pay for?



While our work to protect children is wide and varied, here are some examples of the sorts of things your money could help pay for:

could help pay for printed materials for the children, parents and teachers we work with in schools on Internet Safety. These sessions help adults understand what they can do to help keep children safe online and teach children how to keep themselves and their friends safe.

could help pay for a Helpline Operator to answer calls for an hour, ensuring those who need advice, information and support receive it. Our Stop it Now! Helpline is for all adults with concerns about child sexual abuse. It allows people to talk in confidence, often at times when they feel they have no one else to talk to.

£20 could help pay for 20 Parents Protect! Learning Programmes on disk so families who do not have internet access can watch the video. This 30 minute film shows how to create a family safety plan with simple steps that create safer environments for children.

helps pay for a Stop it Now! Helpline caller to have a call-back with a specialist Lucy Faithfull Foundation practitioner. This service is available for those with particular needs and allows them to receive specialist, in-depth information, help and advice.






£150 helps fund a place on our educative course for friends and relatives of internet offenders (Inform). This allows people to get the support, information and advice they need to protect children.

£150 would enable us to deliver a Parents Protect! workshop to a group of parents and carers in a community near you! These educational sessions raise awareness of child sexual abuse and provide positive messages about what can be done to protect children. They focus on dispelling common myths about child sex offenders while at the same time arming parents and carers with sound information that will help them keep their children safe.

pays for a child or young person with worrying sexual behaviour, as well as their family, to receive help from a specialist Lucy Faithfull Foundation practitioner. Families often turn to us after struggling to find help elsewhere.

£700 allows an internet offender with limited means to attend our ten week Internet Offending educational course (Inform+), which is designed to help offenders understand and manage their behaviour, helping to prevent further offending and reduce the risks to children.





What can you do?

Fundraising comes in all shapes and sizes – as do the fundraisers!

People who have raised money for the Lucy Faithfull Foundation in the past have run marathons, held dinner parties, climbed mountains, swam the Channel and hosted a charity music gig!

You could:

- ✓ Make it seasonal! An Easter egg hunt for spring, a summer BBQ, an autumn bonfire party or a Christmas carol service
- ✓ If you're a talker, how about a sponsored silence?!
- **✓** Games console contest with your friends
- ✓ A non-uniform day at work or a themed dress-up day perhaps?

Planning tips and guidelines

Planning

Once you have decided what you want to do, you can sort out the details; when, where and with who. You can see if any equipment or venues are needed and identify if anyone could assist with this.

Collecting funds

If you set yourself a target for your event or activity, try and keep it realistic! Every little helps and no amount is too small.

Make sure you tell everyone you know about your plans. You can ask family, friends, and colleagues. If people you are close to donate generously to start with, it will encourage others to do the same.

You can collect using sponsor forms (with this pack) and/or use an online facility.

Promotion and publicity

You can promote and spread the word about your fundraising efforts in many ways. You could email, use Facebook and Twitter. Ask your friends to help by sharing and retweeting the link to your page.

We have included a basic poster in this pack for you but if you make your own, please publicise your events as 'in aid of the Lucy Faithfull Foundation'. If you are using our logo, you will also need to add the following information:

Please note that The Lucy Faithfull Foundation does not sanction house to house collecting – which can be illegal without a licence.

Raffles and lotteries

Raffles are classed as a type of gambling and are subject to certain legislation. If your raffle is small, and held on one day, tickets can be sold with cloakroom style tickets. Any other raffle will need a licence from the district council. Full guidelines on raffles and lotteries are available from your local authority or the Gaming Board; these must be followed in full. Events

When planning an event you should consider health and safety. Please consider these points:

- Conduct a risk assessment to ensure that you have proper plans for the safety of participants. Visit the Health and Safety Executive website for information www.hse.gov.uk.
- Make sure people taking part are fully briefed and discuss any risks, if relevant, such as fitness requirements, special equipment or clothing.
- Make sure you have adequate supervision for your event.

If children are involved this requires extra consideration:

- Make sure there is adequate adult supervision.
- Check that the child's parents/guardians have given permission for their child to take part.
- Be sure to carry out appropriate background checks if adults are to have unsupervised access to children.

Some other considerations include:

- You may need to have insurance for your event.
 The Lucy Faithfull Foundation cannot accept any responsibility for your event nor for anyone who participates in it.
- If you are selling alcohol, you will need to check to see if you need a licence. Your local council will be able to help.
- Always have two people present to count the money you raise.

Gift Aid

Please ask those who donate to tick the Gift Aid box on your sponsor form. This enables us to claim tax back from the government and increases the overall benefit to us.

Company approaches

Local businesses may be happy to help you. If you are thinking of approaching a national company, contact us as we may be able to help.

Start talking!

To prevent child sexual abuse we need to start talking about preventing it. The media is full of stories about children being harmed, normally by a stranger, and the stories are created after the abuse has taken place. The reality is that the abuser is more often known to the victim. Talk to your family, friends and colleagues about what you are doing to protect children and ask them to think about what they can do. Take some resources to your school, faith group or community centre to start a discussion.
